# New snowmobile trail connects Alcona, Iosco counties

Snowmobilers riding between Alcona and Iosco counties will have a shorter, more direct route this season now that two trails have been connected via M-65.

It's taken almost eight years to connect five miles of snowmobile trail between the two counties, but the project was officially finished and the trail opened on Friday, Dec. 16 with a ribbon cutting cer-

According to Jeff Matthews, chairman of the Iosco County Parks and Recreation Board, the new trail connects Trail 6 on the south side of the AuSable River by River Road and M-65 to Trail 96 (by the Oasis plaza) which runs through Alcona County north to McKinley.

"This has been going on for approximately seven and a half years with 10 different agencies involved," Matthews said. "I've waited a long time for (the ribbon cutting). It took the cooperation of a lot

It's a great asset to our snowmobile trails for both counties."

Numerous federal agencies were involved due to the trail's proximity to the hydroelectric dam owned by Consumers Energy, because the bridge was on the national historic register and also because the trail crosses U.S. Forest Service property. Several state agencies were also involved including the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) because wetlands were involved and the Michigan Department of Transportation. The Iosco County Road Commission, Consumers Energy and CenteryLink (a telecommunications tower is in the proximity of the trail) were also involved. There was even an endangered species impact study required.

Matthews explained the trail utilizes two forest service roads and a Consumers Energy service road between two dams. "We did have to clear and build a trail through of people and many different a forest wetland and swamp about 1,200 feet and we built a trail around the Consumers Energy administration building at Five Channels Dam - about 1,200 feet," he said.

"I want to give special thanks to Roger MacNeill of the DNR (Lincoln field office) for his help and cooperation in getting this completed." Matthews said. The project was also supported by the Michigan Snowmobile Association, the AuSable Valley Trail Riders and the Hale Area Trailblazers.

This is a good place to cross the river," Matthews said. "It's a good place to get food and gas.'

In addition to the ribbon cutting on the M-65 bridge Friday, there was also a ribbon cutting ceremony at the

# Tigers defeat Hurons on the road

By the end of the first quarter, with the score tied at 11 for the fourth tie of the period, it appeared that the Alcona varsity boys basketball team had a battle on its hands.

It has always been difficult for the Tigers to win at Rogers City and it looked like this time was going to be no different.

Tiger Brock LaVergne started the game strong scoring six of Alcona's 11 points. Bryan Layton picked up two quick fouls and had to sit out the rest of the quarter. After the Hurons went ahead 13-11 to start the second quarter, Layton evidently resolved to make up for his early mistakes. He did not draw another foul and scored 13 points as Alcona went on a 17-0 run. After Andrew Chamberlain scored a basket, Alcona had a 30-16 lead. Rogers City responded with a 7-0 run of their own, but still trailed 30-23 at halftime.

With the score 32-25 early in the third quarter, the Tigers went on another 7-0 run to increase their lead to 39-25. Rogers City broke that streak with a field goal before Alcona finished the quarter

with an 8-0 run; the game was pretty much over with the score at 49-27. Layton again led the attack with eight points.

With Coach Seth Coffing substituting freely, the Tigers were still able to play the Hurons evenly only losing the quarter 16-14.

The 63-43 victory was the largest margin of victory of the short season for the Tigers and put their record at 2-1.

"We adjusted well defensively in the second half and held them to four points. Our defense is improving, 'Coffing

### -Police Report

Deputies from the Alcona County Sheriff's Department and members of the Huron Undercover Narcotics Team (HUNT) were called to a residence in Alcona Township on Wednesday, Dec. 14 at about 6:30 p.m. to handle an incident involving an elderly man who was threatening to shoot

According to Alcona County Sheriff Sgt. Scott Stephenson, the incident was defused and the man was taken to Alpena Regional Medical Center for treatment by 8 p.m. He explained that while the incident had been reported as a 'barricaded gunman," the situation was not the case.

"A barricaded gunman is someone who refuses to come out - it is a voluntary situation. In this case, it was more of a mental health issue. This was an elderly man in his 80s with a specific diagnosis," Stephenson said.

Stephenson explained the man's name will not be released and no charges are pending because of the man's diagnosis and need for treatment. The man was armed, however, no shots were fired and no one else was in the home at the time of the incident.

I was so relieved to find out recently though, that the creativity beast runs rampant at this time of year and no matter how hard some of us try to squelch this monster...it appears.



# Finding doctors who accept Medicare

Dear Savvy Senior,

What resources are available to help seniors locate and research Medicare doctors? My husband and I are approaching age 65 and need to find a new internist or primary care doctor who accepts Medicare. Our current doctor is not enrolled with Medicare and will not continue seeing us as Medicare patients.

**Looking For Care** 

Dear Looking,

Depending on where you live, finding a new primary care doctor or specialist that accepts Medicare patients can be challenging. Because of low reimbursement rates and greater paperwork hassles, many doctors today have opted out of Medicare or they're not accepting new patients with Medicare cov-

With that said, Medicare is now offering a service that makes finding Medicare-approved doctors a little easier. And, there are a number of good resources available today that can help you check up on prospective doctors for free.

The government's new online "Physician Compare" tool is one of the easiest ways to locate doctors in your area that accept traditional Medicare. Just go to www.medicare.gov/find-a-doctor where you can do a search by physician's name, medical specialty or by geographic location. Or, if you don't have Internet access you can also

get this information by calling (800) 633-4227.

Keep in mind, though, that locating a Medicare-approved doctor doesn't guarantee you'll be accepted as a patient. Many doctors limit the number of Medicare patients they accept while others have a full patient roster don't accept any new patients. You'll need to call the individual doctor's office to find out.

Another option you may want to consider is to join a Medicare Advantage plan. These are government approved, private health plans (usually HMOs and PPOs) sold by insurance companies that you can choose in place of original Medicare. These plans may have more doctors available than original Medicare does. See www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan to research this option.

After you've found a few Medicare-approved doctors that are accepting new patients, there are plenty of resources available today that can help you research them. Some of the best include HealthGrades, Vitals and RateMDs. These are free doctor-rating websites that provide important background information as well as consumer comments and ratings from past patients.

Here's a breakdown of what each site offers:

 Healthgrades.com provides in-depth profiles on around 750,000 U.S. physicians including their education and training, hospital affiliations, board certifica-

tion, awards and recognitions, professional misconduct, disciplinary action and malpractice records. It also offers a five-star ratings scale from past patients on a number of issues like communication and listening skills, wait time, time spent with the patient, office friendliness and more.

 Vitals.com provides some basic background information on around 720,000 U.S. doctors along with unedited comments from past patients and ratings on things like promptness, bedside manner, accurate diagnosis and

 Ratemds.com primarily offers ratings and anonymous comments from past

It's a good idea to check out all three doctor-rating sites so you can get a bigger sampling and a better feel of how previous patients are rating a particular doctor.

Another good resource to help you gather information is at angieslist.com (888 888-5478). This is a fee-based membership service that also offers doctors ratings and reviews from other members in your area for \$7.60 for one

# That "free" lunch could cost plenty

Senior News Line **By Matilda Charles** 

Those free-lunch seminar scams are still going on. That's because it's lucrative for scammers. They want to separate you from your money, and too often they succeed.

The American Association of Retired Persons has released a study on victims of scam seminars and other financial risks to seniors.

The study showed that people who are more likely than the general population to fall for investment scams have the following behaviors: They will listen to sales pitches on the phone, attend promotions where a free night's stay or a meal is given, provide personal information to salespeople, allow people to come into their home for a sales pitch, read junk mail, not hang up on telemarketers, and call 1-800 numbers to send for free information.

In other words, they're opening themselves up to being scammed.

Even if one of these financial seminars is hosted by your local senior center or another trusted local organization, do your homework in advance. Call the center to ask who checked

it out, and how. Go online and do a search for the company's name. What are their true qualifications? Are they local? See if there are any complaints at the Better Business Bureau.

And if you go to a free lunch seminar (don't go, but if you do): Don't fill out any forms that give your personal information. Even giving your telephone number could be a step toward being harassed. They'll want to visit you at your home, where you're more vulnerable and have all your financial information handy so they can determine how much you're worth and decide how to fine tune their approach.

And leave your checkbook at home.



### River Aux Sables Chapter - DAR

River Aux Sables Chapter of Daughters of the American Revolution met at the Willow Tree Restaurant in West Branch, Mich. for the last meeting of the year. Guest Speaker was Donnie Boursaw, director of the LDS Family History Center in West Branch, Mich.

Boursaw has been director for 22 years, beginning before much was known about genealogical tracing. Her early tracing was mostly by trial and error experience as was that of most of us who began our genealogical efforts before "Roots" stirred up the interest in tracing your family tree in the 1970s.

Boursaw related the Church Latter Day Saints in Salt Lake City, Utah is the largest repository of genealogical records and information in the world. The five story genealogical library with two sub basements and **Granite Mountain Repository** in Utah has more than a billion genealogical records, and is in the process of being digitalized for further safety and security. The climate controlled tunnels of Granite Mountain are capable of keeping the records they hold on film and actual loose leaf records and books, safe and intact for the next 200 years.

There are over 5000 LDS genealogical research sites in the United States most housed in designated LDS churches, but a few, like the Gladwin site, are in public



### StarWatch By Gary Becker - Low Sun, High Hopes



This has been a strange autumn, at least for those living along the Eastern Seaboard. After coasting along under mild conditions during most of October, we were lashed by a crippling nor'easter on the 29th, the earliest major snowfall in recorded history. Within a week the ice was gone and so was the cold snap. Through November, most outdoor activities happening during the afternoon hours could still be conducted with just a light jacket. Now that we are approaching the Holidays, more seasonal conditions have become apparent, but the air still does not have the bitter bite of December. The National Weather Service's

long range forecast through mid-January predicted a much colder than normal autumn with higher amounts of precipitation and multiple major winter events before the New Year. Autumn seems to have pounced early, and then rolled over to play dead. Even if the meteorological chronometers are having trouble ticking to the calendrical dates, the clockwork universe "tocks" to a precision that cannot be denied. The sun's southward motion has slowed to an almost imperceptible rate and will halt completely on the morning of December 22 at 12:30 a.m. EST, to be precise. Old Sol will be at its winter standstill position, or as astronomers call it, the winter solstice. Fall will be gone, and winter will be upon us. At that moment I plan to be outside listening very intently to the first telltale sounds of "creaking" as the sun reverses itself and begins that barely noticeable rise against the celestial vault. It will take a month before people start to perceive the slight increase in the length of daylight, and another month before cars parked in the afternoon sun begin to feel cozy upon entering; but gradually the changes will occur as the sun continues to climb ever higher into the sky, melting winter into a budding spring. I guess you could simply call it high expectations for a low sun. www.astronomy.org

Though never cheap, by the early 1850s, Colt revolvers were inexpensive enough to be a favorite with Americans headed westward during the California Gold Rush.

## DNR adds more than 500 acres to Pigeon River Country State Forest

The Michigan Department of Natural Resources (DNR) has completed a recent purchase of more than 500 acres of private land within the Pigeon River Country (PRC) State Forest in northern Michigan.

The acquisition of the property occurred through a partnership with the Little Traverse Conservancy, assistance from the Headwaters Land Conservancy, and with funds from the Natural Resource Trust Fund.

"This land acquisition simply makes sense," said Scott Whitcomb, DNR unit manager for the Pigeon River Country State Forest. "Given the size and location of the property and the natural resources that occur there this is a perfect addition to the PRC.

The 517-acre tract of land, the second largest piece of private property within the PRC, is a natural fit for the state forest system. The land is bordered on two and a half sides by state-owned land

with a level to gently rolling topography. The property also contains a nearly one mile stretch of the Black River and approximately one-half mile of Saunders Creek. Both waterways are situated in the headwaters area of the Black River system, an area that is a highly regarded "blue ribbon" brook trout fishery.

'We are excited about this land acquisition. It nicely ties together the southern portions of the Pigeon River Country State Forest," said John Walters, chairman of the Pigeon River Advisory Council and president of the Headwaters Chapter of Trout Unlimited. "The Pigeon River Country is a special place and the addition of the portions of Saunders Creek and the Black River make it all that much more special, especially for folks interested in quiet recreational opportunities.'

The property will be managed as part of the Pigeon River Country State Forest in accordance with the Concept

managing for timber and wildlife, specifically elk and other forest wildlife habitat, as well as for fisheries habitat. The property will also be open to the public at all times for hunting, fishing, trapping,

of Management. This includes wildlife viewing and other resource-based recreation.

'Thanks to the Natural Resources Trust Fund, the purchasing of this land is an outstanding addition to the PRC and should provide to be a huge benefit to the citizens of Michigan," Whitcomb said.
